Join us on Saturday morning April 20<sup>th</sup> for a Spring birding and nature walk at Warwick County Park in Chester County. Warwick County Park is a beautiful rustic park with miles of trails through woods, meadows, and wetlands all along the peaceful French Creek. We will spend the first part of the morning looking and listening for early migratory songbirds such as wood thrush, orioles, oven-bird, and a variety of warblers. The park is also home to a large population of bluebirds, as well as pileated woodpeckers, flickers, red winged blackbirds, and dozens of other species of songbirds. We will then conclude with a 2 mile hike through the woods on well maintained, somewhat hilly trails that offer a combination of wildlife, history, and interpretive trails.

## Salt and Light

### A monthly look behind the scenes at the mission and ministry of FPC This month: Sunday School Teachers

Someone once said that the church is always only one generation away from extinction—if we do not share our faith with the next generation there will be no future church! Much of that sharing of the faith occurs of course in families. But a strong spiritual formation program for children and youth is also important. It is one of the ways that we as a congregation keep the promises we make at each child's baptism.

Each year, the Spiritual Formation Committee provides an alternative program during the Sunday School hour and provides a "thank you" breakfast for our teachers and advisors. At this year's gathering, we asked the teachers to reflect on their experiences and how they have been blessed in serving this way. Here are some responses:

#### **How as a Sunday School teacher I have seen God at work...**

- *I see God through the children's eyes, hearts, and arms. I look forward to their joys and hugs every week.*
- *Watching all the arms go up with eagerness and vigor when we ask 'Who wants to read the lesson first?'*
- *The knowledge our children have of the Bible when they reach our classroom, either from home or previous teachers.*

#### **What I like best about teaching Sunday School...**

- *Having all of the senior high students take the Bible stories they learned in the previous grades to see how what they learned can and should be applied daily in their modern world.*
- *Getting to know the kids. They are so funny, cheery, and exuberant in 4th and 5th grade.*
- *The bond that forms between not only the students but also their families and the teachers...I love learning and repeating the Bible stories through a child's eyes and minds.*
- *So many things [including] listening to their joys and concerns, listening to them read the word of the Lord and interpret the reading.*

#### **An unexpected blessing in teaching Sunday School...**

- *The number of friendships I have formed—and have an extended family.*
- *We have learned more about the Bible and the lessons it teaches and we love hearing the perspective of the kids. They teach us as much as we teach them!*
- *Because I started teaching 4-5 grade and then moved on to senior highs, I was able to witness the growth of the young people even through and beyond college. I was blessed to see them grow up.*
- *Having the pleasure of teaching those who are children of students I had when I first started being a Sunday School teacher (!)*

## Update from the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee

Our first major task was the completion of our “Church Information Form” or “CIF”. This nine page document defines who we are and who we are looking for. It sounds like a simple task, but required many hours of discussion to answer questions such as:

- Brief Mission Statement
- Description of our church/organization programs or accomplishments.
- Describe what gifts, skills, and experiences your congregation possesses to fulfill its mission.
- What are the key theological issues of our church and society that are reflected in the ministry of your congregation/organization?
- Major Responsibilities: For what specific tasks, assignments, and program areas will this person have responsibility?
- Description of characteristics and qualifications needed in a person who will fill this position.

Tough questions! All of the above questions had to be “answered” using no more than 1500 characters! The recently Session approved “Mission Study” and AP Job Description were helpful in responding to these questions.

Our “CIF” has been submitted to the Session for approval. It will then be sent to the Presbytery for approval. Upon approval, which we expect, it will be posted on the General Assembly’s Website, a bulletin board listing available positions. All those searching for an AP position will then respond by submitting their “Pastor Information Form” (“PIF”) directly to us. We will continue to keep you informed on our progress.

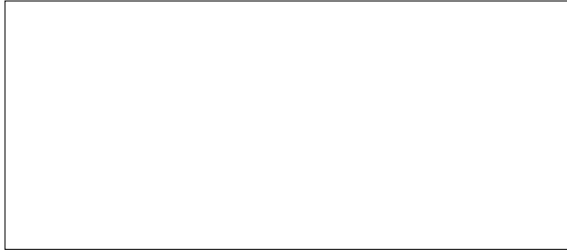
## THIRD ANNUAL GOLF OUTING TO BENEFIT CLUSTER
