Make no mistake: if He rose at all it was as His body; if the cells' dissolution did not reverse, the molecules reknit, the amino acids rekindle, the Church will fall.

It was not as the flowers, each soft Spring recurrent; it was not as His Spirit in the mouths and fuddled eyes of the eleven apostles; it was as His flesh: ours.

The same hinged thumbs and toes, the same valved heart that-pierced-died, withered, paused, and then regathered out of enduring Might new strength to enclose.

Let us not mock God with metaphor, analogy, sidestepping, transcendence; making of the event a parable, a sign painted in the faded credulity of earlier ages: let us walk through the door.

The stone is rolled back, not papier-mâché, not a stone in a story, but the vast rock of materiality that in the slow grinding of time will eclipse for each of us the wide light of day.

And if we will have an angel at the tomb, make it a real angel, weighty with Max Planck's quanta, vivid with hair, opaque in the dawn light, robed in real linen spun on a definite loom.

Let us not seek to make it less monstrous, for our own convenience, our own sense of beauty, lest, awakened in one unthinkable hour, we are embarrassed by the miracle, and crushed by remonstrance. (John Updike, Seven Stanzas at Easter)

Make no mistake about it; what happens is not natural like spring. No, Easter is nothing less than God at work. Will you join us on the road to the cross—and the empty tomb?

#### **Music Notes**

As we continue our journey through the Lenten season, we continue to pray that the music chosen lends your ear to hear God and seek to recognize and respond to His presence in your life.

The Chancel Handbells begin Communion Sunday with the prelude "Kyrie" by Cathy Moklebust. The Chancel Choir will offer the beautiful "Out of the Depths" by Richard Frost. Its text is based on Psalm 130:1-5. Deb will play Massenet's "Meditation" during the offertory and two Mark Hayes pieces during communion: "Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross" and "I Need Thee Every Hour." Zipole's "Toccato" in C Major" will close the service as the postlude.

During the Healing Service on April 5th, Deb will perform "Come, Just As You Are" by Mark Hayes as the prelude. Jo Ann Bathurst will serve as the soloist for the service.

On April 9th, Deb will begin the Palm Sunday service with Dubois' jubilant "Hosanna". All the choral ensembles from our music ministry will offer selections during the service as well. The Cherubs will sing "Jesus is Riding" and Celtic Singers will present "Shout Hosanna!" followed by the congregation's favorite, Faure's "The Palms" by the Chancel Choir. This year, Chip DePrefontaine will be featured as the baritone soloist. The organ postlude is "Sinfonia" by J. S. Bach.

The Maundy Thursday prelude is Reimer's beautiful arrangement of "Fairest Lord Jesus." which will be followed by several haunting choral arrangements: "O Sacred Head Now Wounded," "Man of Sorrows," "No Other Lamb," and two Craig Courtney pieces, "Abba" and Thy Will Be Done." John Genther will close the service with "Were You There."

Our Easter Sunday services will be filled with joyous musical offerings. Gary James will be organizing and rehearsing the "congregational instrumentalists" for the sunrise service. The prelude heard during the 8:30 and 10:30 services will feature our brass ensemble, trumpets: Richard Strunk, and Guy Keenan, trombones: Henry Yorgey and Patrick Sample, tuba: Daniel Foust, timpani: John Rozum and organ: Deb Voytko in Lloyd Larson's jubilant arrangement of "Crown Him With Many Crowns." The Chancel Choir will offer Courtney's "Hark, Ten Thousand Harps and Voices" at both services and McDonald's "Joy Comes in the Morning" as the offertory at the 8:30 service. Jo Ann Bathurst will be directing the children's choirs during the 10:30 service. The Cherubs will offer "Halleluia!" and "Hodie" will be performed by the Celtic Singers. The Brass will also be accompanying the congregation during the hymns and the singing of Handel's Hallelujah Chorus. After which we will need to batten down the hatches for the Easter organ postlude, Handel's "Jubilation." \*\*Special Note\*\* - The Chancel Handbells will be ringing several anthems prior to the prelude at the 10:30 service! Come out early and enjoy!

# Our Endowment and Acorns of Faith




