Dear Friends,

Here is a question that has arrested our attention recently: *what “uncommon, humdrum thing glows in the memory” of Christmases past?* We’ve been thinking about that question. How would you answer it?

Writer Anna Quindlen asks the question in a short piece, “The Time Machine.” Quindlen speaks as her older self to her younger self, a mother of young children caught up in the stress of producing the magic of Christmas for her young family. (A stress which, interestingly enough, is not new. “In 1874, a British actress wrote ‘Christmas is a season of such infinite labour, as well as expense...that every woman I know is good for nothing in purse and person for a month afterwards.’”)

It is common knowledge that the month leading up to Christmas can be full of infinite labor as well as expense. In the face of this, some would offer bromides such as “Relax,” “Let it go,” “don’t sweat the small stuff, and it’s all small stuff.” But, Quindlen responds, “That’s absurd. Lots of small stuff is really big. My children can track their childhoods in tree ornaments...” The trick is to “figure out what small stuff is passing minutiae and what is enduring memory. Find that. Worry about that,” charges Quindlen.

How many of the things that glow in our Christmas memories were made of small stuff, humdrum things that somehow became uncommon because they were the portals through which the spirit of Christmas entered our days? The moment when the room was darkened and the tree lights came on, the card from the friend we felt had forgotten us, squatting before the nativity scene to put baby Jesus in the manger, the look in the eyes of the man receiving the meal tray, the book or song that appeared only in the season when darkness came early, the pink and purple candles in the Styrofoam ring, watching the woman with Alzheimer sing every word of the carol, picking out pajamas for the child you’d never meet, the calendar with the doors, the smell of cranberry bread passed out to the neighbors, standing on the ladder to hang the greens in the sanctuary, leaning against the older brother in the pew as the carols were sung, the smell of wax as the light of the candle spread...

There is power in the small stuff, in the small moments, small gestures, more power in them, perhaps, than in the mound of presents under the tree or food upon the plate. Doesn’t God more often choose small stuff as the portals to enter our lives — a whispered word, a young girl, a little town, a manger, a star, a baby?

“Advent is the liturgical season of vigilance,” writes Robert Barron. As we enter the season of waiting, let us be vigilant in looking into the small things, putting effort into small gestures, caring about the small stuff. Some of that humdrum small stuff will one day glow in our memory as the moment when God drew near.

- Received the Treasurer's Report and approved the monthly allocation to the Mission Fund. The allocation to the Capital Improvement Fund was deferred.
- Approved purchase of four stoles for choir robes from the Memorial Fund.
- Developed a vision for our ministry in 2017 including goals and focus points for ministry..
- Approved an expenditure of approximately \$2500 from 2017 Porter-Broward funds to pay for a heating/air conditioning unit for newly dedicated Camp Kirkwood cabins so that they can be used year-round.
- Approved a Sexual Harassment Policy now required of all Presbyterian Churches by our insurance carrier.

- Approved the job description for a part-time (15 hrs./mo.) interim staff position to handle responsibilities related to the Sunday School until the Associate Pastor position is filled.

Music Notes

The music during this lovely time of anticipation fills the heart with hope. Our Chancel Handbells will ring us in to service on December 4th with Judy Phillips' "An Advent Fantasy" which is based on the three 14th century hymn tunes "Genevan" by Bourgeois, "Nun Komm, Der Heiden Heiland" (its text was composed by Martin Luther and the inspiration for a cantata by Bach) and "Puer Nobis" - "What Star is this that Shines so Bright!" The Chancel Choir will offer Mark Shepperd's "Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus" as the anthem. Deb's offertory, communion and postlude pieces, "Canticle of Turning", "Lost in the Night" and "My Lord, What a Mornin'" will be played on piano while J.S. Bach's "Canticle of Joy" will all be performed on the organ.

The Chancel Choir's anthems for this advent season are truly beautiful! Larson's "Surely, the Time is Near" and Cindy Berry's "Keep Silence", featuring Tim Detwiler on clarinet, will definitely set the tone of awe and wonder! The Chancel Handbells will also be performing on Sunday December 18th. Their prelude to the service is entitled "Carols for the Newborn King", based on the hymn tunes "Cradle Song", "Sussex Carol", and "The First Nowell".
