## From the Co-Pastors

Dearly Beloved,

Here's a question for you: what do Andy Lane and Katherine G. Johnson, the extraordinary NASA mathematician whose story is told in the movie "Hidden Figures," have in common? Answer: they have both served as the chairperson of the Administrative committee of their Presbyterian church!

Here's another question for you: what do Katherine G. Johnson and Dr. Brian Blount, president of Union Presbyterian Seminary who preached to us in November, have in common? They were both part of the same congregation in Newport News, Virginia. Before becoming a professor of New Testament, Dr. Blount served as the pastor of the Carver Memorial Presbyterian Church, the congregation of which Katherine Johnson has been a member for over 50 years. Dr. Blount remembers this "true space heroine" as a remarkably humble person—he was the pastor at Carver three years before he had even heard about her early work at NASA! Johnson, now 98 years old, has been a "wonderful Presbyterian," comments Blount, and she "served in all kinds of capacities at the church" when he was there.

One more question: what did Katherine Johnson have in common with the astronaut whose life depended upon her mathematical calculations, John Glenn? You guessed it: their Presbyterian faith. Glenn, who died in December at age 95, was a lifelong Presbyterian. Glenn grew up in Westminster Church in Cambridge, Ohio, where his mother was the first woman ordained a Ruling Elder in that congregation, and his father also served as a Ruling Elder. Glenn himself married a Presbyterian, and eventually served on the Session of National Presbyterian Church in Washington, D.C.

We wonder if Katherine Johnson and John Glenn knew, in those turbulent, shameful days of segregation depicted in "Hidden Figures," that they were sister and brother to one another? It is sad to think that in their time these two people of faith would have met tremendous obstacles to worshipping and sitting at the Lord's Table together. But it is good to think that it was that same faith which helped to shape them into the gracious, honorable, humble public servants they were, and that same faith which, in time, helped to "tear down the dividing walls of hostility" which separated them.

Dividing walls of hostility still exist, as we know. This month of February, designated in the United States as Black History month, is a good time to look around and inward, trying to see where walls still stand, and wondering where figures of great strength and spirit might be hidden from our view by the color of their skin. "How good and pleasant it is when sisters and brothers dwell together in unity."

## Search Committee Update

The Search Committee has received its orientation from the Presbytery’s Commission on Ministry and had its first meeting. Various leadership roles were divided up: Don Kisela will be serving as Moderator for the Committee and Rosie Roseo will be responsible for communications with the congregation. The first order of business for the Committee is to draft a “Ministry Information Form,” which is necessary for calling an Associate Pastor. That form describes the church and what we are looking for in an associate pastor, and must be approved by the Session and Commission on Ministry before it can be posted on the national job website. The Committee will be looking either for an ordained Associate Pastor for Children, Youth, and Families, or a non-ordained Director for Children, Youth, and Families, depending on which person has the best skill set for the church. Please keep the Committee in your prayers as they begin meeting weekly!

## Session Digest

At its January 25 meeting, the Session:

- Shared joys and concerns.
- Received the report from Treasurer Michelle Thompson regarding 2016. Although giving fell short of budget, expenses did as well, especially in Personnel because of Jeff's departure. We finished 2016 with a \$4049 surplus after all money due to Mission and the Capital Improvement Fund is transferred.
- Received the Stewardship Committee report showing that we have 177 pledges for \$395,522 for the year compared to 166 pledges for \$394,390 last year.
- Received the recommendation of the Personnel Committee for 2% increases for staff and approved the 2017 budget. The terms of call of the pastors must also be approved by the congregation at the annual meeting on January 29. The approved budget will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting.
- Thanked Michelle for her faithful service as Treasure for 14 years (!). Elected Jon Allen as Treasurer once he and Michelle complete the transition.
- Received the final Porter Broward report for 2016.
- Approved required actions for the church's Vanguard money market account.
- Learned that the contract has been signed for construction of the labyrinth to begin after Easter. Costs for the labyrinth will be paid by donations from church family members.
- Approved Carter and Kerry taking study leave January 30-February 6 and for Tom Craver to be invited to preach and lead worship on February 5, 2017.
- Agreed to prepare, serve, and clean up for the Lenten Supper on Wednesday, March 22, 2017 with Patty Picardi and John Livezey heading up the team.
- Elected Mindy Lipsky to replace Gina James on the Endowment Committee.
- Received the good news from the Nominating Committee concerning the slate of officers to be submitted to the congregation for election at the annual meeting.
- Received a status report from the search committee. Agreed that the Committee should pursue a two-track search for an ordained or non-ordained person, as was done three years ago.
- Received reports from the committees and Deacons.

Bach during the offertory and “Open Our Eyes” with “Be Thou My Vision” arranged by Mark Hayes and “I Love You, Lord” arranged by Wyrzten during communion. Handel’s “Fugue in C Major” will be performed as the postlude!

We welcome Scott Sample as the organist/pianist on Sunday, February 12th and thank him for his talents, contributions and dedication to our ministry. Those adorable Cherubs will sing “The Church Has Many Colors” as the anthem during our service. We look forward to their angelic voices! The Chancel Choir will offer “Ubi Caritas” by Ola Gjeilo. The piece had been one of Gjeilo most performed pieces since it was written in 2001. Gjeilo studied at the Norwegian Academy of Music and the Royal College of Music in London and completed his Master’s degree at The Juilliard School. His music is revered and performed throughout the world. “Ubi Caritas” will be sung in Latin, with a translation in the bulletin.

The prelude, “Improvisation on Resignation,” by Martin will open the service on Sunday, February 19th. Our Celtic Singers will sing “How’re We Goin’ To Praise The Lord,” and the beloved hymn “God of Grace and God of Glory” will fill the sanctuary as the Chancel Choir’s offertory. Anna Laura Page’s “May the Grace of God Go With You” will move our spirits as the benediction response and Deb will complete the service with Bach’s “Concerto No. 2 in G Major.”

We begin Sunday, February 26th’s service with Deb’s gorgeous prelude, “When Morning Gilds the Skies” with “Morning” by Edvard Grieg arranged by Reimer, as we celebrate the Transfiguration of the Lord. The Chancel Choir will offer the Alan Smith’s arrangement of the beloved anthem “Christ, Whose Glory Fills the Skies.” Deb will play J.S. Bach’s “Air” during the offertory and conclude the service with Hopson’s arrangement of “Joyful, Joyful We Adore Thee.”

## Health Ministry News

**February is American Heart Month.** Did you know **cardiovascular disease** is the **nation's No. 1 cause of death of both men and women**? Let's all take steps to reduce our risk!

Schedule a visit with your doctor to talk about heart health and set goals for improving your health.

Add exercise to your daily routine. An easy way to start is by walking 15 minutes, 3 times a week. If you have limited mobility, there are many heart healthy exercises you can do in your chair.

Increase healthy eating. Cook heart-healthy meals at home at least 3 times each week. Swapping out salt for spices and herbs is a good start. There are also websites with helpful heart healthy recipes and tips.

Take steps to quit smoking. If you currently smoke, quitting can dramatically cut your risk for heart disease and stroke. Learn more at <https://www.cdc.gov/tobacco/campaign/tips/quit-smoking/index.html>

Take medication as prescribed. Talk with your doctor about the importance of high blood pressure and cholesterol medications.

### **Have you heard of "Hands on CPR"?**

Hands-Only CPR is CPR without mouth-to-mouth breaths. It is recommended by the AHA for use by people who see a teen or adult suddenly collapse in an "out-of-hospital" setting (such as at home, at work or in a park). It consists of two easy steps:

Call 9-1-1 (or send someone to do that).

Push hard and fast in the center of the chest.
