Letter from the Co-Pastors

“And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father’s only son, full of grace and truth...From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace.” (John 1:14,16)

Dearly Beloved:

Christ is born! In Christ, the Word has become flesh and God has pitched His tent among us. Since Bethlehem, And there is nothing that can dislodge Jesus Christ from this world or from our lives. He is with us...always. The wonder of Christmas, the gift that keeps giving, is that Christ is here. May we search for your gentleness when it is covered with harshness in another.
May we observe your generosity in every gift we receive, no matter how small it is.
May we reveal your mercy when we pardon someone for having turned against us.
May we welcome your joy in the delightful voices and happy play of children.
May we convey your compassion when we visit those with illness and poor health.
May we detect your patience in those who put up with our impatience and hurry.
May we unite with your peace hidden beneath the layers of the world’s disharmony.”*

Would you join us in trying an experiment with us in the new year? Would you try to pray this prayer each day for a week...or two...or even a month? Would you then let us know in an email if praying this prayer makes any difference for you on the days you pray it?

Christ is born! May the wonders of his birth resound in our lives long after the Christmas decorations are put away.

A **Candle of Lament** has been placed in the front of the sanctuary for personal or congregational use in times of trouble. Wrapped in rough wire, the candle is a symbol of the both the pain of struggle and the light of God's presence which is often obscured, but shining, in the midst of it. You are invited to come to the sanctuary and light the Candle of Lament as you pray. You may also find it meaningful to place one of the rough rocks at the foot of the cross, or carry one with you as a sign of your burden. When you are ready, bring it back to the cross and lay it down before the One who shares your suffering. Prayers for your use are available at the Lament candle.

Labyrinth

Last spring, we announced the receipt of a gift of funding for an outdoor prayer labyrinth from Polly Gower in memory of her husband, Ron, a beloved friend, elder and Clerk of Session of our congregation. Plans for the installation of the labyrinth have progressed slowly, but now the way is clear! When weather conditions are right, construction of the prayer labyrinth will begin in the late spring. Design drawings for the project will be on display in the Community room in January. We are grateful for Paul Lepard Jr.'s generous donation of time and expertise in the design and oversight of the project.

The landscape design for the labyrinth includes three additional opportunities for gifts in memory or honor of loved ones. Three benches and their accompanying plantings are available at the cost of \$2,500 each. If you are interested in giving a bench and plantings as a memorial gift, please contact Kerry.

Session Digest

At its December 11 meeting, following worship, the Session:

- Heard from the Commission on Ministry of plans to conduct an “exit interview” with the Session as required after the departure of any installed pastor.
- Approved Carter and Kerry taking leave January 1 and for Tom Craver to preach and lead worship in their absence. Carter and Kerry hope to be away welcoming their first grandchild.
- Agreed that Communion will be received by intinction in worship on Sunday, January 1.
- Approved moving the Session meeting to January 25 to give an extra week for the Treasurer to close the “books” on 2016 and work with the Admin. Comm. to prepare a budget for 2017.
- Approved a day of retreat being led by Amy Shutt at the church on Saturday, January 28.
- Received the Treasurers’ Report and allocated all money owed to mission to date. Post-poned any allocation to the capital improvement fund.
- Empowered the Administrative Committee to sign a contract for construction of the Labyrinth with all costs being covered by donations. Approved soliciting donations for three benches.
- Approved publicity of the AmazonSmile program with all proceeds (.5% of purchases) being deposited in the General Fund.
- Approved demolition and removal of the silver church sign facing Franklin Street.
- Discussed a report and recommendation of the Worship Committee regarding the “coffee hour”/fellowship time following worship. Approved the recommendation beginning in February.
- Learned that Sarah Pinard has agreed to serve in the interim staff position to resource the Spiritual Formation Committee and Sunday School while the Associate Pastor position is vacant.
- Received a status report from the Stewardship Committee.
- Also received reports from the Spiritual Formation and Admin. Committees
- Approved the Mission Study in preparation for the Associate Pastor search.
