 it * Open your shades * Sing together * Share your skills *
 Take back the night * Turn up the music * Turn down the music *
 Listen before you react to anger * Mediate a conflict *

 Know that no one is silent though many are not heard * Work



Health Ministry News

Medicare Updates-If you or your loved ones are on Medicare you know you will be receiving a new Medicare card in 2018. The CMS (Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services) wants you to be aware of a common type of fraud that is occurring. If you receive any type of phone call regarding your new card and asking for your social security number do not take the call. CMS has stated that you will never receive a phone call from them regarding your card or asking for personal information.

If you or a loved one is hospitalized with Medicare, please be aware of the Hospital "Outpatient" Observation Status. Observation Status is a designation sometimes used by hospitals to bill Medicare. Just because you are receiving care in a hospital does not mean that you are classified as inpatient. This can greatly affect how your stay in the hospital is billed along with a subsequent transfer to a skilled nursing or rehab facility. Living Generously—Your Advent and Christmas Response

During the season of Advent, our congregation was given many opportunities to give generously, to help the less fortunate, and donate in new ways. We began the season with our “Table to Tree” market. Volunteer bakers created and donated 63 pounds of cookies, which Marcia Zeigler and her Mission elves combined into trays and packages for sale at the market. Our cheesecake baker, Mike Ziembra, single-handedly baked and donated 27 cheesecakes. The Women’s Bible Study “soup ladies” filled every big pot in the kitchen, and produced 120 quarts of soup, not to mention the 54 bowls they served for lunch!

In all, we raised \$2,391 to support our Adult Mission trip for hurricane relief. Folks also contributed to some of our other favorite causes; \$800 to our Living Waters work in Honduras, \$104 to Kirkwood Camp, \$370 to Heifer International, and \$329 to SNEHA (from sales of their hand-crafted items). We stuffed forty stockings for our Community Meals guests, and purchased 150 outfits for children to put in gift bags for distribution at Cluster. Another collection yielded enough money to supply 2400 rolls for the Cluster Christmas baskets. Thank you!!
