## Letter from the Co-pastors:

*I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?  
I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.  
Isaiah 43:19*

Dearly Beloved,

One of the signs of the vitality of a plant or tree is the appearance of new shoots of green growth. In the same way, one of the signs of vitality in a branch of Christ's vine is the appearance of new shoots of fresh growth among us – new people, new ideas, new ministries, new songs, new leaders, new renditions of old themes (*check out "Pathways through the Parables" in this newsletter*). In the scriptures, whenever the Holy Spirit shows up, new things spring forth – not to replace the old, but to refresh the familiar.

We would like to tell you about two new things that will be appearing over the summer. First, we hope that in the coming months you will see signs of the construction of a prayer labyrinth outside the Peace Garden. Over the past few years, on a retreat or workcamp or during Lenten school, you may have experienced the canvas prayer labyrinth we have borrowed from our Baptist neighbors. A labyrinth is a path for taking a prayer walk. Since the days when Jesus walked the earth and logged thousands of miles with his disciples, Christians have referred to their life with Christ as a 'journey,' or a 'daily walk with God.' As Dr. Tom Long writes "If you are a Christian, keep your bags packed and your eye on the highway, because the life of faith is a continual journey." A prayer labyrinth provides a way to meditate and reflect on our journey with God.

Because the labyrinth has been a meaningful way to pray, several people have offered to give this 'new thing' to the congregation as a gift in memory of loved ones. We will have more to share with you about that as the project moves forward. But for now, keep your eyes open for this new thing that will be springing forth in the area where the wooden stakes are currently placed in the grass.

The second thing that is springing forth is a new partnership with Mosaic Community Gardens. For years, Barbara Longstreth and various accomplices have planted, maintained, and harvested vegetables in our church garden, benefitting the Cluster and individuals with little access to fresh produce. Now, the reach of this little plot of ground will expand. Mosaic Community Gardens, which already maintains several gardens in Pottstown, will now manage the garden. Under this partnership, the garden will produce a harvest of not only vegetables, but also knowledge and skills, as the Mosaic staff will involve boys and girls from the community in the work of the garden. Children from the Olivet Boys and Girls Club and the Pottstown High School will tend the garden, and learn how to use the produce in preparing healthy dishes. Keep your eyes on the garden patch and see what springs forth in the coming months!

We rejoice in the signs that the Holy Spirit is in the vicinity, giving us new ways to grow deeper in Christ, and reach farther in love.
