Letter from the Co-Pastors

Dearly Beloved:

In the midst of a big win over the Redskins on October 23, the Eagles star left tackle, Jason Peters, was injured and lost for the season (*bet you can figure which one of us is writing this cover letter!*). As he was carted off the field, fans saw a rare sight: nearly the whole team came out on the field to wish him well. One of Peters' teammates, Jason Kelce, later explained, "He's been a leader here ever since I've been here. He takes young guys under his wing. He's been the best possible teammate you could ask for. And he doesn't need to be. He's a Hall of Fame tackle making an unbelievable amount of money. He could do whatever he wants, he's that good. But he doesn't do that. He's a very — we call it *uncommon*."

We might also call it "generous." We tend to think of generosity strictly in terms of money and material possessions. To be generous, however, is to be open-hearted and open-handed with our money, but also with our experience and wisdom, our time and talents, our words and our attention, and most of all, our love.

We have a choice, we can be miserly or we can be generous. We can be miserly with our words and quick to criticize, or we can be generous with our words and free to encourage and affirm. We can be cheap and hold tightly to our resentments and grudges, or we can be generous with our grace and forgiveness for others. We can hold fast to what we have, thinking that we must be self-reliant, prepared to get by only with our own resources. Or, we can be generous even when we seem to have little, trusting that by the grace and provision of God we will have enough of what we need.

It is in God as revealed in Jesus Christ that we have our example and source for generosity: "who though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant." (Phil 2:6-7). In Christ, God poured out his love for us, freely and extravagantly. How can we best show our gratitude for God's gifts? How can we find contentment? By living generously.

Gratitude – Generosity – Contentment: one leads to another in a joyful circle grounded in the generosity, gifts, and grace of a loving God. May we be generous, not just with our money, but with ourselves, not just in stewardship season, but throughout the year. With God's help, let us be "rich in good works, generous, and ready to share...so that we may take hold of the life that really is life." (1 Timothy 6:18-19)

Family Faith Formation

I recently discovered *Faithful Families* by Traci Smith. This is a great book that contains dozens of ideas for traditions or ceremonies that “create sacred moments at home”. I’d like to share with you the Gratitude Tree for Thanksgiving.

Gratitude Tree

You will need:

Construction Paper

Scissors

Hole Punch

Crayons/Markers

Yarn

A tree or bush

1. Create ornaments by cutting out circles of construction paper, punching a hole in them and tying a loop of yarn through the hole. Make at least 3 for each family member.
2. On Thanksgiving Day, either before or after the meal ask each family member to write down at least 3 things they are grateful for (one on each ornament). Younger children can draw.
3. Gather outside at the tree. Take turns naming what you are thankful for and hanging the ornaments on the tree.
4. After everyone has hung their ornaments say “*Our tree is full of so many reason why we are grateful this day. Let us continue our celebration together knowing that our lives are full! Let’s all say AMEN!*”
5. Invite everyone to take their ornaments home with them.

I hope this activity helps you create a sacred moment at home this Thanksgiving! -Jeff
