Letter from the Co-Pastors

Dearly Beloved:

As we write this cover letter, our thoughts and prayers are turned towards Pittsburgh, and the terrible loss of lives at a Jewish synagogue at the hands of a man filled with conspiracy theories about Jews and immigration, and filled with hate. At times such as these, questions abound: How long must we witness such hatred and violence? How are we to respond as a church and as Christians and citizens?

There is another question that also lurks close to the surface for many of us: how safe are we at church? That we ask that question, even if only fleetingly, is understandable. Who wasn't at least a bit nervous the first time they flew after 9-11? The truth is, however, that by far the most dangerous activity we do when we come to church is to get in our cars. The most dangerous room we will enter on a Sunday, as measured in serious injuries and fatalities, is not a room at the church, but our bathrooms. But who is going to stay away from their cars or not enter their bathrooms? We want to be prudent but we also don't want to overreact.

Speaking of prudence, in the past six months, an Emergency Preparedness Taskforce from our congregation made up of representatives from the Deacons and our Administrative and Spiritual Formation committees, along with Jeff and us, met with representatives from the Pottstown police and fire departments, looked at what other congregations do, and made recommendations which the Session unanimously approved. What we quickly realized is that the biggest emergencies we face are the medical emergencies suffered by individuals in the congregation. Do you know that we have an automatic defibrillator at the back of the congregation and that the ushers have a list of medical personnel that they can tap to help someone with some kind of medical condition as happened a few weeks ago in worship? The next biggest concern is the threat of a fire or serious storm. Do you know that we have four exits from the sanctuary (two in the front)? And, in the case of storms, that the best place to be is an inner room away from windows?

A new pew card will remind us what to do in the case of medical, fire, or storm emergency. We are also taking some other common sense steps such as having more fire exit maps, a walkie-talkie in each of the childcare rooms (which means that the volunteer will no longer have to leave the room to contact the parent of an inconsolable or sick child), and a direct link to our security company so that there are ways to contact the police or fire in addition to calling or texting 9-1-1.

But even as we take these steps, we will continue to be the church. That is, we will continue to follow the way of Christ and refuse to let fear or hate rule our lives. Instead, we will trust in God and love fearlessly, confident that by God's power love will conquer hate. On November 11, when we dedicate our offering of time, talents, and money to God, may we also dedicate our lives to "Live Courageously," in the coming year. With God's help may faith, hope, and love continue to be the watchwords of our lives!


