# News from the Parish Nurse

#### It's not too late for a flu shot!

As we all know, the Flu can have serious complications for healthy people as well as for young children, older adults and those with certain chronic conditions. It is VERY important to get your vaccine for yourself **as well as for** the protection of others! People infected with the flu may be able to infect others beginning I day before symptoms develop and up to 5-7 days after becoming sick. A flu shot **cannot** cause flu illness because vaccines that are given by a needle are not made with live viruses. The nasal spray vaccine is made with a weakened virus and also cannot cause the flu illness. The CDC recommends getting a flu vaccine for everyone over 6 months of age. The vaccine is thought to best protect against the flu for at least 6 months.

If you missed your chance to try **Glo Germ** to test your hand washing technique or didn't get your healthy hands goodie bag visit Nurse Dawn in her office!

My office hours will be posted by the I<sup>st</sup> of each month on the Health Ministry bulletin board in the hallway across from the office. ## **Music Notes**

The music during this lovely time of anticipation fills the heart with hope. Our Chancel Handbells ring us in to service on December 6th with Robin Benton's "An Advent Celebration" which is based on the hymn tunes "Branle De L'officiel", "Coventry Carol" and "Antioch." The Chancel Choir's anthems for this advent season are truly beautiful! Barrett's "An Advent Yearning", Sorenson's "Come To Us", Manz's "E'en So, Lord Jesus Quickly Come", and Dickau's "Love Came Down at Christmas" will definitely set the tone of awe and wonder, as we wait with an air of expectancy. Variations on several French carols will be featured this month, including "Il Est Ne, le Divin Enfant" from the 18th century, "Sing Ye Noel" from the 16th century, and "Sing We a Glad Noel." What's Christmas without a little Bach? We'll hear his "O Hail This Brightest Day of Days."

Offerings from Deb at the keyboards include "As the Dark Awaits the Dawn," which was composed for the I0th anniversary of the St. Olaf Christmas Festival, "O Lord, How Shall I Meet You?" and the lively Cameroon song, "He Came Down." There will be a rhythmic postlude on Israeli tunes, sure to set your toes a-tappin'.

The lovely Welsh folk song, "All Through the Night," will be played as the prelude for the Service of Wholeness. The constancy of the eighth notes in the harmony brings to mind both the quiet ticking of a clock and the consistent comfort of the Lord, all through the night.

Along with the preparations for the annual Christmas pageant, our Children's Choirs will be singing during the December services as well. The Cherubs will offer "Light One Candle" by Natalie Sleeth on the 13th. On December 20th, the Celtic Singers will sing "The One True Light" by Page. Join the music and rec children and members of the children's choirs at the 5:00 PM for their presentation of the Christmas pageant during the 5:00 PM Christmas eve service.

You won't want to miss the wonderful music planned for the Christmas eve service! The prelude music begins at 10:00 PM with the Chancel Choir and soloists singing selections from Handel's "Messiah." They will be accompanied by a small string ensemble which includes 2 violins, viola, Jeff on bass and Deb on the harpsichord. A Christmas classic, "Gesu Bambino," played by Scott Sample on the piano and Deb on the organ will be featured during the offertory. Please join us at 10:00 PM as we celebrate the birth of Jesus through our musical offerings.


# Faith in Families
