Dearly Beloved:

- An important letter from the Session concerning the recent Porter Trust gift to this congregation (see the insert). As announced at our January 31 congregational meeting, the gift gives us a great opportunity to make a difference now and to lay an even stronger foundation for future generations to build on, just as we have built on the labors, sacrifices, and gifts of previous generations. With this gift, come special challenges and responsibilities. We are so grateful that a special 2004 Taskforce from this congregation gave us a blueprint to follow. We are excited now for what comes next with the “mission tithe.” May we be guided by God throughout this transition so that we might prove worthy of the trust God has placed in us.
- An introduction to a new international partnership we are entering through “Living Waters for the World” (see the insert). A small team has been trained and we look forward to sending them and other volunteers to Honduras to install a filtration system to bring clean water to a village. What an ingenious way to improve the lives of others.
- An update from Haiti from representatives of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, as well as how you can make a special contribution if you would like to do so. Not long after the first headlines appeared about the earthquake, emergency assistance was being sent down to Haiti because of the contributions we and other congregations have made for “The One Great Hour of Sharing” collected every Easter.
- News about the Ash Wednesday Service and the programs available for all ages this Lent on Wednesday.
- Information about “Financial Peace University,” a spiritual financial educational program that has strengthened the lives of many individuals and families

And that does not include all of the rest—potluck suppers, Seekers’ events, Sunday School breakfast receptions, puppet shows, the New Orleans mission trip and the other ways that ministry takes place in and through this congregation. ## **Lent at First Presbyterian Church**

### **Ash Wednesday Service: February 17, 7:30—8:15 p.m.**

During Lent, we prepare ourselves for Christ's death and resurrection. We begin the season on Ash Wednesday with a quiet time of reflection and worship in the Community Room. We will mark ourselves with ashes, the sign of our human weakness and mortality, and we will remember God's unfailing grace and mercy shown to us in Jesus Christ.

## Session Digest

The Session met twice in January. At a special meeting on January 11, the Session discussed the Martha Porter Trust gift and made decisions that are summarized in the insert to this newsletter. At its regular January meeting, the Session:

- Shared joys and concerns.
- Reviewed the Officers' Retreat held on Saturday, January 16 at Camp Innabah.
- Approved including a "Reaffirmation of Baptism" for the congregation in worship on Sunday, January 31. Kerry reported on plans for the service.
- Heard that the minutes and records of the Session have been approved "without exception" by the Presbytery. The Session expressed its appreciation to Jane Barndt for her fine work as Clerk of Session.
- Received the report from Treasurer Michelle Thompson regarding the 2009 Treasurer's Report which showed that the church was able to meet all mission commitments and end the year with a positive balance for 2009 thanks to very generous giving in December.
- Received the wonderful news from Stewardship that resident members of the congregation increased their pledged giving by 8% for 2010.
- Approved the budget for 2010 which will be presented to the congregation at the congregational meeting.
- Approved paying for installation of a surge suppressor protection system, as recommended by the Admin. Committee at a cost of \$7500 using funds from the Martha Porter gift.
- Approved setting aside funds to conduct an energy study by the Energy Task Force at a cost of \$5000, using funds from the Martha Porter gift.
- Received the report from John Genther and the Nominating Committee about the slate of officers to be presented at the congregational meeting.
- Postponed action on the recommendations of the Child Safety Taskforce until February.
- Approved the motion that the congregation enter into a covenant relationship with Living Waters for the World.
- Received reports from Stewardship, Administrative Committee, Endowment, Fellowship Committee, Christian Education Committee, Nominating, Mission, Hospitality, and Worship Committees, and the Deacons and Clerk of Session..

## **Branches of the Vine—Reaching Out to Make a Difference**

### **Helping in Haiti**

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is coordinating its efforts with our ecumenical partners in the relief work in Haiti. PDA sent \$100,000 to Haiti for emergency supplies immediately after the earthquake from funds on hand from the “One Great Hour of Sharing” offering that members of our congregation and congregations across the denomination contribute to every Easter. More money has been since then for emergency supplies. Now the focus is on providing emergency shelter. PDA and its partners are seeking to bring in 20,000 tents to Port-au-Prince in this next week for the one million people estimated to be without shelter.

Presbyterian mission co-workers stationed in Haiti, Mark and Jenny Hare, recently wrote: “Port au Prince has been deeply wounded. Jenny and I have no answers for any of these problems. Just the reminder...that our God is a God of hope, that despair has already been defeated, and now is the time to face what has happened and to act, act out of that hope and not out of despair. I don’t have any idea what that will mean. But our God is up to the task. Pray for us that we will also be up to the task.”

Please keep the people of Haiti in your prayers. If you would like to make a contribution, you can make your check out to the church and write “Haiti relief” on the memo line.

### **Living Waters for the World**

Our congregation has entered a covenant to send a team to install a filtration system and provide training for a village that lacks clean water through the ministry, “Living Waters for the World.” See more details in the insert to this newsletter. On February 21, come and hear Rick Moyer and Karen Keiser talk about their trip to India with another Presbyterian church (see p. 4).

### **New Orleans Mission Trip**

On Saturday, February 27 and February 28, a team of 18 First Presbyterians are heading to New Orleans. They will stay in the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance village, “Olive Tree” and help residents of New Orleans to rebuild their homes. They return on Saturday, March 6. Tom Zeigler is serving as coordinator. Please keep them in your prayers.
