Dearly Beloved:

Lent is the season of the church year stretching from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday. Lent is often associated with penitence and "giving things up." But Lent, which literally means "springtime," is not intended just to be a "downer" when we give up a few pleasures. Instead, we should see it as a time of preparation and tending the "soil of our souls" so that the roots of our faith might deepen and the fruits of our faith might blossom. We acknowledge our sins and shortcomings, because that is the first step for change and growth. But we always do so with an awareness of God's power and grace. As a result, Lent can also be a time for looking to the joy of God's presence. Like a snowdrop blossom while winter still lingers in the air, joy can show up in what seems to be the unlikeliest of times and places—because God is always showing up there.

So for the six weeks stretching from Ash Wednesday to Holy Week, let us tend the soil of our faith so that God's seeds might grow...

...through worship on Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday and the Sundays in between. During Lent, we will be preaching a series on some of Jesus' most confounding parables, asking "What in heaven's name is Jesus talking about!"

...through daily times of prayer and reading the Scriptures, reflecting on our days and our lives. The devotional resources written by church members that will be distributed by the Spiritual Formation committee can be a real gift to all of us;

...through our acts of service for others and our times of fellowship with the body of Christ. Join us on Wednesdays for dinner, fellowship and two new opportunities for study and discussion.

May we all might arrive at Easter and say, "What a great season this has been!"

Lent at First Presbyterian Church

Ash Wednesday Service: February 22, 7:30—8:15 p.m.

During Lent, we prepare ourselves for Christ's death and resurrection. We begin the season on Ash Wednesday with a quiet time of reflection and worship in the Community Room. We will mark ourselves with ashes, the sign of our human weakness and mortality, and we will remember God's unfailing grace and mercy shown to us in Jesus Christ.

Wednesdays During Lent (beg. Feb 29)

There are two tracks for adults and two offerings for children:

Track One: Biblical Explorations

Spend two weeks exploring the Gospel of John with Dr. Kenneth Maahs of Eastern University and then two weeks with Rabbi Daniel Zuker of Congregation Mercy and Truth exploring the Bible and archaeology. It all adds up to four stimulating weeks of deepening our understanding of God's Word.

Salt and Light

A monthly look behind the scenes at the mission and ministry of FPC
This month: <u>SNEHA Ministry in India</u>
(Society for Nurture, Education, and Health Advancement)





Thank you from the children of SNEHA.

Several years ago we received a visit from Reeta Rao, who with her husband Hari, decided to dedicate their lives to the poor in India. Since then we have followed with wonder how they have brought this vision to fruition. They are working in the northern city of Dehradun with the expressed desire to uplift the urban poor, focusing mainly on women and children. SNEHA is a charitable Christian organization that services people of all religions, and weaves Christian teachings into their formal education program.

Picture a large slum area where lack of employment opportunities has forced people into collecting all kinds of waste products for recycling, and being known as "rag pickers". Major problems include a lack of public toilets, scarce water supplies, open drains, and garbage thrown all over the place. How does one start to help a community like this? With fierce dedication, and complete faith in God, Reeta and Hari began working in the community in 1993.

Since then, and with the help of Christian organization throughout the world, they have built a school that gives formal education to over 400 children ages 5-18. Part of the tithe from our recent Vision Fund went towards the construction of a new wing for the school. Children who cannot attend school due to child-minding or other domestic help at home are helped in the slum with informal education.

Health awareness is promoted through both a health clinic and the training of community health workers to work with people in their homes. Women's empowerment activities include literacy programs, skill training classes, and self help groups. SNEHA also works with the government and the community to improve their living conditions.

Reeta has been a visitor at our church on two occasions, and we are always honored to have such a dedicated Christian in our midst, as well as being inspired by her message of hope for people in need. A recent flood at the school caused major damage, but with the help and prayers of churches around the world they continue to do God's work among the lower cast in India. Through our Mission Committee, we provide financial support to SNEHA each year and consider them an important international partner.

Session Digest

At its January 25 meeting, the Session:

- Shared joys and concerns.
- Reviewed the Officers' Retreat held on Saturday, January 16 at Camp Innabah. Elders volunteered to serve on a Parish Nurse study team and a Digital Media "Think Tank" that is being formed. Volunteers from the congregation will also be solicited.
- Received the report from Treasurer Michelle Thompson regarding the 2011 Treasurer's Report which showed that the church was able to meet all mission commitments and capital fund allocations and end the year with a positive balance for 2011 thanks to very generous giving in December. The Session approved the final mission and capital fund allocations.
- Received the wonderful news from Stewardship that resident members of the congregation increased their pledged giving by 6% for 2012.
- Approved the recommendations of the Personnel Committee regarding staff salary and benefit
 increases. Approved the Personnel Committee's proposed changes to the terms of call of the
 co-pastors, which is subject to approval by the congregation at the annual meeting on Jan. 29.
- Approved the budget for 2012 which will be presented to the congregation at the congregational meeting.
- Approved moving the February Session meeting to February 22 because of the adult mission trip to Nashville.
- Agreed to prepare, serve, and clean up for the Lenten Supper on Wednesday, March 21, with Patty Picardi agreeing to serve as coordinator.
- Agreed that the congregation will celebrate in September the 50-year anniversary of the move
 of the church to this site in 1962 and recognize all those who have been members for 50 years
 or more.
- Ratified the nomination of Patty Picardi to succeed Chad Stacks as chair of the Endowment Committee, the timing of the transition to be worked out by Chad and Patty.
- Approved the expenditure of \$5460 from Capital Improvement funds to pay for the cover up
 of all exposed HVAC pipes in the kitchen, Fellowship Hall and adjoining stairwells.
- Approved the expenditure for up to \$3800 for a new freezer. The Administrative Committee
 is currently researching options and can now proceed on the purchase of the best option as
 deemed by the Committee..
- Received reports from Stewardship, Administrative Committee, Endowment, Fellowship Committee, Spiritual Formation, Nominating, Mission, Hospitality, and Worship Committees, and the Deacons and Clerk of Session.

Worship: That those unable to attend worship in the winter months will be remembered.

Fun and Fellowship: For enthusiastic participation in our new activities.

Administrative: Prayers for guidance for ongoing projects.


