## From the Co-Pastors

### **Grace and peace to you, through our Lord Jesus Christ!**

In a couple of weeks, the cloth on the communion table will turn from the green of ordinary time, growing time, to purple, the color of the church seasons of preparation, in this case, Lent. In the early church, Lent began as a season of preparation for believers who wanted to be baptized. From the second century, baptisms were administered once a year, on Easter Sunday, as believers turned their back on the old life and were raised to new life in Christ. The early Christians understood that moving from the old life into the Christian life does not happen overnight; it takes time, and attention, and will, to shed the old life and clear the way for the new. So before they could be baptized, they had to fast, and pray, and prepare.

The pattern for a 40-day season comes from Moses, and Elijah, and especially Jesus, who entered into periods of spiritual focus and discipline, even testing, as they prepared for their life with God. In their time of preparation, they fasted, emptied themselves of distractions and things that made them 'flabby' in spirit; they prayed, faced their human frailties, confessed their sins, got 'cleaned out, cleaned up;' they exercised their spirits and got stronger. In short, they were honed in spirit, made fit, ready to embark on the journey with God into fullness of life.

Over time, it became clear to early Christians, as it is all too clear to us Christians in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, that following Christ into fullness of life takes more than one season of preparation. This is how it goes for us in the Christian life: in one season we are earnest and resolved to following the Way of Christ, and in another season, we get flabby in spirit, lagging behind or falling away. The cycle of the church seasons expresses what we all know to be true: as long as we live in mortal flesh, we need times of turning again to what is essential, to focus and strip down and strengthen our will, time to die again to the old life so that we can rise again to new life in Christ.

And so, the cloth on the table will turn to purple, and we will turn inward, trying to focus again on what is essential to our souls. How will we do this? You decide. Find ways to turn from your old life towards Christ. Find your way to *pray* daily – use devotional materials provided in the lobby, read the Essential 100 texts. Find your way to *fast*, to strip excess from your life --whether food, or activity, or noise, or possessions. Find a way to *exercise* your faith – serve or study or share your faith, in Lenten school (see p. 3), or outreach, or small groups of Bible study or prayer. Not because God will not admit you to the kingdom if you don't, but because you will be better able to make the journey to the kingdom if you do. Here is a prayer we have found meaningful as we turn towards Lent: **(see p. 9)**

## **Lent at First Presbyterian Church**

### **Ash Wednesday Service: February 13, 7:30—8:15 p.m.**

During Lent, we prepare ourselves for Christ's death and resurrection. We begin the season on Ash Wednesday with a quiet time of reflection and worship in the Community Room. We will mark ourselves with ashes, the sign of our human weakness and mortality, and we will remember God's unfailing grace and mercy shown to us in Jesus Christ.

### **Wednesdays During Lent Are Intergenerational!**

There are two tracks this year—one which is intergenerational and for all ages and one for adults:

#### **Living the Faith: Everybody's Got a Story (Kerry and Rosie Roseo)**

What is your favorite Bible story? What is something you wonder about? Tell me what you imagine heaven is like. Whether we are 5 or 15, 45 or 85, we've got a faith story made up of answers to questions like this. During Lent, we are going to form a "FaithStoryCorps." In family groups or in friend clusters, we will interview, record and preserve each other's faith stories, using photography, art, and digital "studios." ## Salt and Light

### A monthly look behind the scenes at the mission and ministry of FPC This month: Our Choir

Have you ever wondered about those folks behind “the screen” up front in worship—the choir? Why do they commit to coming every Thursday night when they are able to sing from 7:30 to 9:00? What does participating in this ministry mean for them? Here are some of their reflections:

- “There are many reasons why I sing. As we sing every Sunday, it is an offering. I sing to the glory of God and hope God appreciates it! On a more personal note, I enjoy doing something as part of a group and there's no better group than our choir! We do have a good time.” (Jennie Watts)
- “I have sung in church choir since I was six...I find that being in the choir is the way I worship best. Putting the music and words together, trying to interpret what the writers and composers have in mind, that fills me with joy and comfort. To me, music is part of my life and the way I can best express my faith.” (Jane Barndt)
- “I love to sing and to harmonize with others around me. It is a joy being part of the choir as we sing praises to God, and the experience brings me closer to the mystery of the ‘Kingdom.’” (Barbara Longstreth)
- “I can't wait for choir on Thursday evenings. The folks that surround me are so caring and full of fun. We have a rigorous but enjoyable rehearsal. The music we sing fills my spirit and keeps me going for the rest of the week...We feel God's presence each time we are together. Thanks be to God.” (Rob Land)
- “I sing because I can't help myself (much I am sure to the consternation of those who sit nearby), and being close to, and surrounded by, music and all the voices fills me to overflowing. And, if that weren't gift enough, we have so much fun...I cannot remember a Thursday evening where I did not leave feeling better than when I arrived, truly.” (Rob Wade)
- “Participating in the choir is a blessing to me. Choir members are welcoming of all new members and rehearsals are a wonderful opportunity for Fellowship. Singing on Sunday mornings is a form of worship for me and it brings me great joy. The lyrics of the anthems linger in my heart all week.” (Kathleen O'Hara)
- “I feel privileged to sing not just the hymns, but special music. I think of the ability and voice to sing is a gift God has given me and the choir gives me an opportunity to use that gift.” (Shaaron Guinther)
- “For me singing in the church choir is one way to worship our Lord. I like to sing and we have a wonderful, friendly group. I've been singing in church choirs since I was eighteen years old.” (Horace Fletcher)
- “Music is how I worship and connect with my Lord. A sermon is great and I learn so much...but an old hymn with great theology will touch my spirit and I become one with God. ‘It is Well With My Soul’ gets me every time. When I sing this with the congregation or as a solo...I am lost. .singing only to the Lord.” (Beth Ann Straub)
- “I've been signing in choirs since I was a cherub. This church is extremely blessed with a wonderful music program, and the choir and music bring me such joy that I quote a line from one of our anthems ‘how can I keep from singing?’” (Joanne Bianchini)

## Session Digest

At its January 23 meeting, the Session:

- Shared joys and concerns.
- Elected Michelle Thompson Treasurer for 2013.
- Reviewed and approved the Mission Study drafted by a writing group following the joint Session-Deacons Officers' Retreat on January 12. The study must also be approved by the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry before the Search Committee can begin its work.
- Received the report from Treasurer Michelle Thompson regarding the 2012 Treasurer's Report which showed that the church was able to meet all mission commitments and capital fund allocations and end the year with a positive balance for 2012 thanks to very generous giving in December. The Session approved the final mission and capital fund allocations.
- Received the recommendations of the Personnel Committee regarding staff salary and benefit increases. Approved the Personnel Committee's proposed changes to the terms of call of the co-pastors, which is subject to approval by the congregation at the annual meeting on Jan. 27.
- Approved the budget for 2013 which includes the recommendations of the Personnel Committee. The budget will be presented to the congregation at the congregational meeting.
- Approved the expenditure of up to \$8000 to purchase 36 tables and 300 chairs for Fellowship Hall to replace the current tables and chairs. The current ones will be made available to interested churches.
- Heard plans for Lenten School and approved a "timeline mural" being painted on a wall downstairs.
- Received reports from Stewardship, Administrative, Endowment, Fellowship, Spiritual Formation, Nominating, and Mission Committees, and the Deacons.
- Please keep in your prayers:
  - Hospitality: That our congregation will continue to be hospitable and friendly to visitors.
  - Worship: Thanksgiving for prayerful worship.
  - Fun and Fellowship: For good programs to bring people together.
  - Administrative: Thanksgiving for meeting our budget in 2012.
  - Spiritual Formation: For all of the ongoing programs.
  - Endowment: That current members might be moved to create a legacy as prior members have done.
  - Nominating: Thanksgiving for those who accepted the call to serve.
  - Mission: For safe, productive, and Spirit-filled trip to Honduras.

## Recycling at First Presbyterian Church

In order to be more “environmentally friendly”, we have a series of recycling programs here at First Presbyterian that some of you might not be aware of. We encourage you to participate in these programs as you are able.

**Paper Retriever Recycling** – Manor Care has generously allowed us to place the green/yellow container across the street from the church. The company accepts all kinds of paper, including newspapers and excess mail. Just save it up from your home or business, and deposit it in the bin when you come to church. We make \$5.00/ton, with half going to Manor Care, and our share to Mission. Our 2012 totals are 19+ tons collected and \$96.45 received.

**Aluminum Cans** – There are two bins for the collection of these cans, one in the main hallway and the other in Fellowship Hall. **All** proceeds from these cans go to Habitat for Humanity of Montgomery County. We take the cans to Meyer/Pollack on Industrial Hwy, and they always give a little extra to help support Habitat. Our 2012 totals are 160 lbs. of cans and \$91.11 received.

**Ink Cartridges, Cell Phones, Batteries** – Bins for these items are located in the cloak room and in Fellowship Hall. The ink cartridges are sent to the Funding Factory in Erie, PA, and since we started the program in 2010 we have received \$233 for Mission. The cell phones and batteries are dropped off at the North Coventry Recycling Center, located just off Main St. in South Pottstown.

Please keep the church in mind when you are throwing out these items. And---if you have other recycling tips or ideas for us please contact the Mission committee.
