#### Letter from the Co-Pastors

"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, naked and gave you clothing?...And he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these, you did it to me."

(Matthew 25:37-40)

#### Dearly Beloved:

As we finish celebrating Christmas again and hearing the accounts in Luke and Matthew, do you ever wish you had been there? Do you ever wonder what it would have been like to be that innkeeper or one of the shepherds or wise men? Do you ever feel like you might have been born 2000 years too late—that now it is so much harder to believe because we weren't there to touch and see the baby born in Bethlehem?

Dorothy Day, the Christian writer and founder of the Catholic Worker movement once wrote: "It is no use saying that we are born two thousand years too late to give room to Christ...Christ is always with us, always asking for room in our hearts. But now it is with the voice of our contemporaries that he speaks, with the eyes of store clerks, factory workers, and children that he gazes; with the hands of office workers, slum dwellers, and suburban housewives that he gives. It is with the feet of soldiers and tramps that he walks, and with the heart of anyone in need that he longs for shelter. And giving shelter or food to anyone who asks for it, or needs it, is giving to Christ."

And as the surprise of the questioner in Matthew 25 reminds us, we cannot count on Jesus being obvious when he shows up. As Day also writes, "If Mary had appeared in Bethlehem clothed...with the sun, a crown of twelve stars on her head, and the moon under her feet, then people would have fought to make room for her. But that was not God's way for her, nor is it Christ's way for himself, now when he is disguised under every type of humanity that treads the earth."

We are not born too late, because Christ is still with us: he still shows up. And, we can still serve him, as we serve those in need and provide hospitality to those who also find no room at the inns of our day. May we be looking for Him in the midst of our busy schedules and in the faces of those who cross our path. "And you shall call him 'Emmanuel,' God with us." Thanks be to God for Christ is born—and is "Emmanuel, God with us."

# A monthly look behind the scenes at the mission and ministry of FPC This month: Cluster Outreach Center

The Pottstown Cluster of Religious Communities seeks to address the spiritual, social and basic needs of persons within the Greater Pottstown community. The Cluster was started over 40 years ago by a number of congregations in the area including First Presbyterian Church. The Cluster provides a number of services—including Community Meals, an emergency food pantry, a clothing closet, financial assistance, and counseling and referrals—all with the intent to help individuals make real progress in moving from dependence to self-sufficiency. This past summer, the Cluster moved into new quarters at 57 N. Franklin Street.

Our congregation has always been a strong supporter of the Cluster. The Cluster is always one of the largest recipients of our mission dollars, and the church contributed \$120,000 to the building of the new Cluster building—which Cluster supporters have worked for nearly 15 years to see built. Our Christmas clothes at Christmas are distributed by the Cluster to families and children in need, and we periodically collect food and clothing to donate to the Cluster. This year the offering of the children and youth through Sunday School will go to the Cluster. Our Community Meals program (which will be featured in another *Celtic Cross*) is also a ministry of the Cluster.

George Bell, the president of the Board of the Cluster, recently thanked the congregation:

"The Lord will Provide." Do you know that you are part of an answer to prayer? ...Many of the new clients that come to our doors cry first in embarrassment, then in joy that they can obtain groceries, clothing, and financial help with things like prescriptions, utilities and rent. You are providing not only relief, but hope to members of the human family here in the Pottstown area. The Board of Directors of the Pottstown Cluster is extremely grateful for your increasing support of our operational needs and commends you in our prayers. May God bless all of you."

Several church members serve at the Cluster Outreach Center, including **Barbara Allen**, **Nancy Smith**, **Ruth Forney**, and **Dee Phillips**. All four serve as volunteers with the clothing closet. They recently talked about their service at the Cluster: "I don't think I ever take my life and all of its blessings for granted, but spending time at the Cluster truly puts everything in perspective. I work in the Clothes Closet area one day a week, and while it tugs at my heartstrings to see people shopping there, I also am so grateful that our community has a source such as the Cluster to provide for those in need." Another volunteer commented, "I see God working through us as we distribute clothing to people in need. It is very rewarding to see how thankful people are to have good clothes for their children...There is so much need in Pottstown for food, clothing, and household items, and the Cluster gives to the community every day. I am very fortunate to be a small part of that." One volunteer specifically commented on Christmas at the Cluster: "helping out there the last two days has been awesome! Our church should be really proud of the support it gives the Cluster. Many children are going to have a better Christmas because of the clothing given by our church. The clients seem so appreciative...It makes one go home and be very thankful for what our family has."


