## Letter from the Co-Pastors

How has God blessed us in 2010? The Session recently took stock of our ministry and listed the blessings and achievements in this past year. Here is a partial list of what was named:

- That an international mission trip has become a reality.
- That “Children and Worship” has moved from pilot project to ongoing ministry of the church with newly recruited and trained volunteers and the donation of supporting teaching materials.
- That we were able to offer two “Financial Peace Universities” to families.
- The faithful service of so many faithful volunteers week in and week out that makes Community Meals so important for many of our neediest neighbors.
- Our strong Sunday School programming and the willingness of so many volunteers to serve as teachers.
- The Barth Elementary School partnership.
- Our mission trips of adults to New Orleans and the youth to Lewes, DE.
- Our growing small group ministry (Bible studies, Theology Reading Group, Young adult group, Prime Timers, Moms’ Time Out, etc.).
- Those who joined the church this year, including both adults and confirmands.
- A successful transition with new youth advisors and expanded summer programs for youth.
- Continued efforts by volunteers to keep our heavily used buildings and grounds in good shape.
- The formation of the “Company of Elders.”
- The receipt of the Martha Porter trust, our formation of a Martha Porter tithe taskforce, and the efforts of the Endowment Committee to choose an investment advisor to guide our investment and use of the funds.

This last blessing needs elaboration. Several years ago, the church decided to “tithe” or give to groups in our community an amount equal to ten percent of the money received from the Martha Porter tithe. The remaining 90 percent has been invested in our Endowment Fund for future ministry. As you will see from the insert and the Session digest, a taskforce was chosen by the Session that solicited input from the congregation and the community. Three projects have been identified to be funded from the mission tithe, but the taskforce’s work is not yet completed.

But we do not list these blessings to pat ourselves on the back. Instead, we list them to give thanks to God—and as the first step in discerning what God might be calling us to do in 2011. Because with these gifts and blessings come responsibilities. The gifts and blessings of God are not intended to be hoarded for ourselves; they are meant to be shared with others. And even with the gifts and blessings, challenges remain. For example, while we have been blessed by the Porter

At its October meetings, the Session:

- Continued its discussion on looking back (naming the accomplishments and blessings in the ministry of the church in this past year that we should celebrate and give thanks for) and looking ahead (“What do we discern that God is calling us to accomplish in the next year or two so that we can ‘grow deeper in Christ and reach farther in love?’”).
- Approved for Carter to take continuing education leave on November 4-5 to attend a conference on ministry to young adults at Princeton Theological Seminary.
- Approved the baptism of Coulson Kenneth Lee, child of God and son of Ken and Holly Lee, on November 14, 2010, and the baptism of Santiago David Allen, child of God and son of Jonathan and Sandra Rodriguez Allen, on November 28, 2010.
- Approved sending a letter of congratulations and prayerful support to Bethel AME Church;

### **Books by David Guterson**

#### **East of the Mountains**

A good and decent man's passage through life as reflected in his memories and his experiences on what he intends to be his last day on earth is the burden of Guterson's deeply felt, honest and quietly powerful new novel.

#### **Our Lady of the Forest**

This book navigates between the mystical and the cynical in its slowly paced telling of a Marian encounter in North Fork, Washington.

#### **Snow Falling on Cedars: a Novel**

This is the kind of book where you can smell and hear and see the fictional world the writer has created, so palpably does the atmosphere come through. It's a great story, but the primary pleasure of the book is Guterson's renderings of the people and the place. (Courtesy of amazon.com)

#### **Saying Grace: a Prayer of Thanksgiving** by Virginia Kroll


This is a story about a girl named Grace who, through difficult times, learned to count her blessings and say thank you.
