Letter from the Co-Pastors

How can we raise generous children—children who can appreciate the blessings they have received and are not always asking for more? The task is not easy. According to a Kaiser Family Foundation study, today's school-age children spend more than seven hours a day using cell phones, video games, televisions, computers, and other media. All of these deliver consumer-driven messages that urge our children to have the latest and greatest in order to be happy. Nearly fifty hours a week—compared to one or two hours a week hearing the church's message—the odds are against us!

But there are some things we can do. Here are some suggestions from Rev. Kathryn Hauelsen, a parent and pastor who works in the area of money and spirituality:

- Talk with children about why you support the church and other organizations and why you help others.
- Go shopping together for items to donate to children, new mothers, people in nursing homes, or people with special needs.
- When you go grocery shopping, pick up a few items for the Cluster food pantry and bring them to church.
- Serve at Community Meals on Thursday night, work at the Cluster, or find some other way to help those in need. It can make us all appreciate more what we have.
- Pick out together a ministry or charity that your family will support and include your children in the decision about who to give something to and how much to give.
- At Christmas or on a birthday, in addition to the regular gifts, give them a "share-check." Fill out the amount and sign the check, but let the recipient select the non-profit cause to receive the money.
- Teach your children how to write thank you notes. E-mail and text-messaging notes count.
- Give your children an allowance and teach and model the 10-10-80 concept: share a tenth, save a tenth, and spend the rest wisely.
- Model generosity—what we do around our children matters far more than what we say.

How about you—who taught you about faith and money and about being generous? Do you have any suggestions to pass on? If so, we can share them in future issues of the *Celtic Cross*. But growing into generous people is not just for children. May we all grow so that we too can worship with "glad and generous hearts" like the early church described in Acts 2. And may we learn how generosity and gratitude can help us to be "content with whatever we have." (Phil. 4:11). This is who we are meant to be—because we are the church!

I especially enjoy reading Amish fiction books and there are many to choose from in our church library. If you have never been to Lancaster County Amish areas I would highly recommend a visit. Take a drive into the back farm county to visit Amish quilt shops and craft stores on Amish farms or just take a buggy ride, it is simple and easy fun the whole family will enjoy.

Levi's Will by W. Dale Cramer

This book is a heartwarming story of an Amish man seeking to build a bridge between three generations. The main character, Will, is raised in an Old Order Amish community and at the age of 19 leaves his community resulting in a complete shunning by his family and community. This book does an excellent job in taking the reader through the life of Will from the age of nineteen to sixty. The complicated relationship between a father and son is explored. Levi's Will is loosely based on the author's father's life and has a strong message of forgiveness and redemption.


Daughters of Lancaster County by Wanda E. Brunstetter

This is a trilogy about an Amish family trying to overcome a devastating heartache. This inspirational story takes place in an Amish community in Lancaster County. The story is told through the eyes of Naomi Fisher whose mother has recently died. She is left with the responsibility of caring for the house and all her siblings. While watching her youngest brother, Zach, he is kidnapped out of the front yard. This story shows how faith, hope, and forgiveness can finally be brought back into this Amish family's lives.
