Letter from the Co-Pastors

Dearly Beloved:

“From the beginning we have been created to be receivers, not achievers.” The words are those of Craig Barnes, a pastor and spiritual writer. What does he mean? Simply this: there is so much about life that we cannot take credit for because it is a gift outside of our control. After all, we cannot take credit for being born. Our beating hearts and breathing lungs do so without any conscious direction by us. In the same way, we cannot control the rising or the setting of the sun. Life is a gift, time is a gift.

But we are told so often by the world that we need to be achievers: we need to set goals, we need to work hard, we need to achieve our dreams. In a similar fashion, we organize and schedule our time so that we can do everything we need to do. Now, there is nothing wrong with a good work ethic or being organized. The problem is when we think that we can be in charge of our time or that our joy will come from what we do, what we achieve.

“From the beginning we have been created to be receivers, not achievers.” Life begins as a grace, and each day is a gift. We human beings cannot achieve everything or have everything—but that is ok. Because God gives us what we need. As Barnes writes, “along the way, all of the important blessings of life, such as relationships, children, opportunities, calling, and health have come to us not through our achievements but by the grace of God. No mission in life is greater than learning how to receive such overwhelming grace.”

When we understand that we have been created to be receivers rather than achievers, we will count our blessings and take time to name those blessings in our prayers of thanksgiving. When we look at life as a gift, we will stop and pay attention lest we miss something that God is up to, some kind of blessing that we might otherwise overlook, whether it is the smell of freshly cut grass, the smile of a child or the kindness of a stranger we cross paths with on the way to work. When we understand the grace and gift of our lives and our time then we will want to share our gifts with others, because we have truly received so much and truly achieved so little on our own.

In this season of stewardship and thanksgiving, may we pay attention to the many blessings we have received, and giving thanks to God for them, share a portion of what we have received with others.



Alternative Gift Market

The **Alternative Gift Market** on Sunday, November 11 is an opportunity to “shop” for special Christmas gifts for others. It is a chance to support programs and international groups that reach out to the less fortunate in our community and the world. Right here at home in Pottstown, with your generous participation, we will provide 140 gifts of clothing to needy children through the **Cluster**. The **Eco-Boutique** will be open, and it offers a variety of coffee, tea, cocoa, and chocolate bars that support our “fair trade” partners in Central America.

Heifer International’s mission is to work with communities to end hunger and poverty and care for the earth. To that end, Heifer provides food and income-producing animals and training in their care to 12.5 million resource-poor families in more than 125 countries. At the heart of Heifer’s philosophy is the “**Pass on the Gift**” whereby families share one or more of their animal’s offspring with other families in need. You can “purchase” livestock, including pigs, cows, rabbits, beehives, sheep, goats, flocks of chicks, ducks, and even seedlings for trees, and this money will go towards making a better life for a family.

Through the **Medical Benevolence Foundation**, we are “selling” **mosquito nets** that will protect children when they are sleeping, and prevent the spread of malaria. These nets cost only \$10, and that can help save the life of a child.

Our church sent a mission team to the town of San Juan de Planes in Honduras in 2010 to install a **clean water system**. Bill Dupree and Rick Moyer have made two follow up visits to the region, and our church will be installing two more clean water systems in neighboring villages in early 2013. These trips are costly, and the Mission committee wants to make sure that any adult who is interested in participating in this international opportunity will be able to do so. To help with this endeavor we will be “selling” parts of the water system at the Gift Market, so that all who want to go, can go.

Come and bring your appetite for a lunch of hot dogs and home-made barley soup. Come and bring your baked goods for our Bake Table, with all proceeds going to the work of the Mission committee. And come to celebrate and mingle with your church family!

New Clothes for Kids for Christmas

Again this year there is an opportunity to provide children in need in Pottstown with new clothes and/or cozy pajamas at Christmas. The need is increasing each year and we can help. Cards will be available in the large cornucopia in the church foyer during November. Select a card and purchase a new outfit or pajamas in the requested size. Bring these gifts, unwrapped and in a Christmas gift bag, to the church by December 2. These gifts will be distributed to the children by the Pottstown Cluster.

Session Digest

At its October meetings, the Session:

- Discussed the next steps in searching for a successor to Liv. The Personnel Committee will review the current job description in consultation with the co-pastors and Spiritual Formation Committee and present one for Session approval at its next meeting. The hope is to have a new person in place this summer. The Spiritual Formation Committee and staff reported on how Liv's responsibilities will be handled until a successor is hired.
- Authorized the Admin. Committee to take the necessary steps with the church's checking accounts to reduce any bank fees and to permit the Treasurer to have online access.
- Heard that the Prime Timers spaghetti supper raised \$250 for Camp Kirkwood scholarships and \$230 for Prime Timers' activities.
- Received the report from the Administrative Committee that the following work has been completed: steeple repairs, painting of the rear wall in the sanctuary, replacement of 6 toilets in rest rooms by Dave Hollenbach, and cleaning of stainless steel gutter seams. Admin. also approved the purchase of a new computer projector.
- Received the report of the Mission Committee that six walkers walked in the CROP walk for our church and the total raised, \$4300, was an all-time record. Also received the report from Mission that the Committee met with Tim and Gloria Wheeler and another trip to Honduras to install water filtration equipment has been scheduled for February 2013.
- Received the Audit Committee report and referred it to the Administrative Committee to determine how to best carry out the committee's recommendations.
- Received the Treasurer's Report and approved allocations to the Mission and Capital Improvement funds.
- Heard reports from the Fun and Fellowship, Mission, Worship, Administrative, Spiritual Formation, Endowment, Hospitality, and Stewardship Committees and Deacons.
- Please keep in your prayers the following:

Administrative: thanksgiving for the resources to make necessary repairs to have a dry building.

Fellowship: prayers for growing participation in the fellowship events.

Nominating: prayers for wisdom and discernment on the part of the committee and those asked to serve.

Stewardship: prayers that people will respond to the opportunity for church members to grow deeper in Christ and reach farther in love.

Spiritual Formation: thanksgiving for volunteers who have stepped up to cover extra responsibilities during the time a search is going on.

Worship: prayers for Advent preparations.

Hospitality: for those joining the church in our next Inquirers' Class;

Personnel: for discernment on how best to fill the staff vacancy.

Mission: that the Alternative Gift Market will be fruitful and enjoyable.

Family Faith Formation


How can we grow generous children? Here are some ideas
