Letter from the Co-Pastors

Dearly Beloved,

"What's in a pew?" You can tell a lot about a congregation by what you find in the pew racks in any sanctuary. Are there Bibles in the pew? That is a sign that the congregation wants the Word of God to be made available and open to everyone. What hymn or songbooks are in the pew racks? The music that a congregation sings tell a lot about the theology and personality of the congregation that worships in that sanctuary. Are there Friendship pads? If so, you know that a congregation seeks to be welcoming to newcomers and to one another. Are there age-appropriate children's resources? That is a clue that a congregation understands children and wants them to be a part of the worshipping church family.

Very soon, you will see two new additions to the pew racks in our sanctuary. First, you will find a brochure entitled "Worship and Sacraments," written by Kerry, with photographs and layout by Craig Duncan (bless you, Craig!). Copies of this brochure will be available in new member packets, and in the literature racks (please do not remove the copies in the pew!)

After that, with your help, there will be a new songbook, "Sing the Faith," put out by the PCUSA. Our primary hymnal will still be the blue hardcover PCUSA hymnbook: this songbook will replace the current "Lift Up Your Hearts" songbook. "Sing the Faith" pulls together much of the music we have been singing from inserts in the bulletin (e.g. "Will You Come and Follow Me?", "Blest are They," "They Will Know We Are Christians") – as well as other music, from beloved old hymns (e.g. "His Eye is on the Sparrow") to newer music ("As the Deer," "Grace Alone"), to songs from the world church. You can read more about these songbooks, and how you can help, on page 2.

Of course, the clearest sign of what a church is like is found by the most important thing in any pew: worshipping Christians! Looking forward to seeing you in church.

Session Digest

At its September meeting, the Session:

 Approved the baptism of William Keith Dyer, Jr., child of God and son of William K. Dyer, Sr. and Gwendolyn Lint Dyer, on October 16, 2011.

- Sang selections from Sing the Faith with the help of Deb Voytko and approved the recommendation of the Worship Committee to: I) Purchase of Sing the Faith as a supplemental hymnal for the congregation. 2) Transfer the dedications from Lift Up Your Hearts into the new songbooks.. 3) Give members of the congregation an opportunity to purchase and dedicate these new hymnals at \$15/copy; and (4) Make the Lift Up Your Hearts hymnals available to a church that can use them.
- Received and approved a brochure developed by Kerry, Craig Duncan, and the Worship
 Committee that explains "what we are doing here" in worship and celebration of the sacraments. Approved that up to \$500 be spent from the Memorial Fund for copies on heavier
 stock to be placed in the pews. Copies on regular paper will be available in the literature
 racks and in new member packets for members to take home if they would like to do so.
- Received and discussed the financial report with Treasurer, Michelle Thompson. Agreed that the congregation should be informed about our current deficit through the *Celtic Cross*. Approved payment of two months of the mission allocation.
- Reflected on the past year and listed and discussed "the accomplishments and blessings that
 we should celebrate and give thanks for," as the Session prepares to look ahead and establish
 points of emphasis for a new year of ministry.
- Received a report from Mission and approved receipt of the Peacemaking offering.
- Received the news that most of the HVAC replacement has taken place in the newer wing, but the project cannot be fully completed until backordered parts arrive. As part of the project, the church will have a new hot water heater which should result in energy savings since domestic hot water will no longer be required to be heated by the church's main boilers.
- Received a report from the Hospitality Committee on feedback from surveys of those who
 have recently joined the church, and heard that 19 new members attended the recent reception at Kerry and Carter's house.
- Approved promotion of the "Routes of Hope" Run-Walk for the Tierra L. Dobry Foundation.
- Also received reports from the Deacons, Endowment, Fun and Fellowship, Stewardship, and Spiritual Formation committees.
- Prayer requests from the committees—

Worship: Thanksgiving for the new pew brochure and supplemental hymnal and that they further strengthen our worship together.

Fun and Fellowship: For a continuing strong turnout for church fellowship activities. Endowment: Guidance for good investment decisions that honor our donors and congregation members.

Administrative: That we will have the resources to do the projects we need to do. Hospitality: For those who will be received into membership in our next set of Inquirers' classes.

Mission: for the CROP walk and for the Camp Kirkwood work day.

Personnel: For passion and excellence in our staff.

Spiritual Formation: For teachers to inspire our children and children to inspire our teachers. Stewardship: That we might create sacred moments in the midst of our stewardship efforts.

Library in Focus—One New Book

<u>Calendonia</u>: Legend of the Celtic Stone and An Ancient Strife By Michael Phillips


These two books are really a series about our Scottish heritage, written in a fascinating and engaging story. There is an old Gaelic proverb the author uses, "Remember the men [and women] from whence you came." It is a story of love and war, history and intrigue, mystery and adventure, winding back and forth between ancient and modern times.

The hero, Andrew Trentham, and the people in his life move through political strife and compromise, trying to balance personal and national values. It is a story that draws you in immediately and involves you in the lives of the characters. In his notes, Phillips describes the "blurry line between story and history, fact and fiction" as he sees it. These books are a great read and will keep you guessing the outcome right to the end.
