Letter from the Co-Pastors

Dearly Beloved:

September is always a month where life is buzzing at the church as we move from summer into a new program year. Sunday School begins with Rally Day; the Deacons help us cope with the end of summer by having an always-fun church-wide picnic; Seekers resume for junior and senior high youth and their families; music and recreation returns; a new confirmation class begins its journey together on a retreat; volunteers from the church resume or begin serving as tutors and mentors at Barth Elementary School; we prepare to welcome a new class of third graders to the Lord's Table; and ministry takes place in many places, in many ways, with all ages.

September marks the return of familiar rhythms and patterns. But there is also always something new when it comes to ministry in Christ's name. This fall, a new theology reading group has formed, and the Mom's Group has become a monthly Mom's Circle. And we will be soon hearing more from the Mission Committee about the possibilities of a new and exciting ministry of bringing clean water to villages with contaminated water supplies. But one new thing this September is a special joy for all of us: our own Olivia "Mis Liv" Stewart will become "Mrs. Liv" when she and Scott Robertson get married on September 6. Liv will be back in worship on Sunday, September 20. Scott, a senior at Princeton Theological Seminary, has an internship at a Presbyterian church in Bucks County this year.

This month we will also begin a new sermon series, "Generation to Generation." We often describe ourselves as a four-generation congregation, because unlike some congregations, we are not predominantly over 65 or predominantly under 45. Instead, we are a true multi-generational congregation. This can pose challenges: we often travel in different worlds with different points of view and responsibilities. We often dress differently, have different musical tastes, and different expectations concerning the church. And yet what a blessing it is to have the diverse gifts of wisdom, energy, patience, enthusiasm, faith, hope, and love that the different generations offer. Where else in our society do we gather with multiple generations except at family and church events?

Over the past weeks, we have been gathering different generations together and listening—and we have solicited input by e-mail. What are the joys of being the age you are? The concerns? What do you worry about? How has your faith helped you? What questions do you have? In September we will share what we have learned and reflect together on what God has to say to us no matter what age we are. *"From generation to generation, we will recount your praise."*—Psalm 78:13

BACK TO SCHOOL CLOTHING DRIVE

This year the Pottstown School District will enter its second year of requiring students to wear school uniforms. Studies indicate that it takes about three years for a community to get an adequate supply of uniforms in circulation (among families and in thrift stores) to provide for all its students. The children at our partner school, Barth Elementary, still need help finding the clothing they'll need. Here's what both boys and girls will be required to wear:

Shorts—navy or khaki, fingertip length

Pants—navy or khaki

Shirts—collared, light blue or white, short or long-sleeved

Sizes 6—16

You do not need to buy a whole uniform: any piece will be welcomed!

The nurse at Barth keeps a supply of clothing items in her office, to be given out as needed. Clothing may be purchased at any store or thrift shop. **Please bring them to the basket at the foot of the Mission Cross in the front hallway during August and September.**

TUTORS AT BARTH ELEMENTARY...

The tutoring program will begin its twelfth year in October. Last year we had more tutors than ever, but there are always more children who need mentoring and tutoring than there are tutors. We ask for volunteers to commit one hour per week. Studies show such a time commitment will have far more influence than you know. Or perhaps, you would like to lead a monthly book group for a group of fifth graders. Contact Coordinator Karen Keiser and say "YES, I'll help!"

COMMUNITY MEALS

Session Digest from June

At its June meeting, the Session:

- Approved invitations being extended to Rev. Bernarr Rhoades, Rev. Tom Craver, and Rev. Jan Rose to preach and lead worship this summer during Kerry and Carter's vacation.
- Ratified the nomination of Jim Short to chair the Stewardship Committee.
- Received the financial report through May and approved the monthly allocation to Mission.
- Agreed for the Administrative Committee to sign a contract to purchase natural gas through a schools group should the financial terms prove to be advantageous for the church.
- Heard from the Administrative Committee that the playground fence and gate have been repaired, that the new phone system has been installed, and that the church is changing to a local company to test and service the fire alarm system.
- Heard from Christian Education about plans for Vacation Bible School and end of year recognition of Sunday School teachers. CE also reported that they are in the midst of evaluating the pilot project of Children and Worship.
- Approved money from the Memorial Fund to purchase 3 robes for our growing adult choir.
- Established the policy that visiting choirs will sing in worship by invitation of the Session and in consultation with the Music Director.
- Approved a revised Endowment Policy which reflects the changes previously made piecemeal by Session action.
- Heard from Mission concerning "Clean Water U." Four people from the church, Karen Keiser, Bill Dupree, and Rick and Sue Moyer will attend training in Mississippi to learn how to install water filtering equipment in Third World villages where the water supply is contaminated. The Mission Committee is exploring the possibility of sending a team to Honduras. Received a report that two platforms were built at Camp Kirkwood with 25 volunteers and using money from the Vision Fund.
- Please keep in your prayers: our summer ministries; that giving will continue steady over the summer; guidance for Mission concerning Clean Water U; for our summer worship; and for Liv and Scott as they prepare for their September wedding.


