## Letter from the Co-Pastors

Domestic disaster struck us at home two weeks ago—suddenly something went wrong with our well and only a trickle of water was coming out of our pipes. The plumber and well supply company both determined the problem to be an underground leak or problem with the well pump. “Where was our wellhead?” they wanted to know. We had no idea. As city folks, we never thought much about the well as long as it was working—and since we have never had a problem with the well, we had no idea where it was located in our yard. What were we to do? It was hot and showers needed to be taken, dinner needed to be prepared, and out-of-town guests were to be welcomed the next day!

Fortunately, we had good folks helping us. A specialist was sent for who brought special equipment (more sophisticated than a divining rod, we were glad to see) and he located the wellhead and leak, both of which were three feet below the surface. The well supply company hitched us up by garden hose to nice neighbors so we could have dinner and our showers until the well supply company could come back the next day with a backhoe and new pump and make the needed repairs. The out-of-town guests who stayed with us the next night had no idea there had even been a problem. Needless to say, we have a whole new appreciation for wells and water and those who have the skills and equipment to make them work—and for good neighbors.

There are a lot of parallels between our experience with our well and the spiritual experience of Christians. Like transplanted city folks, we Christians can often take the wellsprings of Christian faith for granted—until we face a problem. Neglected spiritual lives, like neglected well equipment, can cause problems—not because God wants to pay us back for not being insufficiently attentive—but because in dry and difficult times, we need deep wells to draw from. And because, when there are problems, most of us are not equipped to fix them: then, it is good to have people with the right gifts to guide us and help us. We also need neighbors who will help us when we cannot help ourselves. This is what the church is meant to be in our lives.

What are worship and Sunday School and Bible studies but an opportunity to find the well, sink our wells deeper, and draw upon the water we need to quench our thirsty souls? What is fellowship in the church body and service in the community but one neighbor sharing water with another neighbor? What is the role of teacher, minister, musician, youth advisor, property committee volunteer and counter but someone sharing their unique gifts and skills to help someone else find what they need to be well supplied at the pump? Join us on Sunday and find a place to serve and a place to be replenished lest your well goes dry at a difficult time! After all, we need water every day!

### **BACK-TO-SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE**

This year's "Back-to-School Mission Collection will provide school supplies for school children in Afghanistan. This summer, our Mission Mornings youth helped to pack school kits with the Mennonite Central Committee in Ephrata. They learned that more kits are needed. Here are the contents of the school kits. Here is what we need and please be precise in purchases (such as size of notebook, etc. because all kits need to be exactly the same):

- 4 spiral or perforated notebooks (about 8.5 x 10.5 in. and 70 sheets)**
- 4 unsharpened pencils**
- 1 ruler (flat, flexible plastic, with both metric and standard markings)**
- 12 colored pencils (in packaging)**
- 1 large pencil eraser.**


