On September 22, 2013, our congregation will have the opportunity to do something it has not done in 165 years of existence: elect an associate pastor. Last January, you elected an Associate Pastor Nominating Committee that has consisted of Bill Campbell (chair), David Duncan, Donna Hutchison, Paul Lepard, Barbara Peckham, Caroline Remelius, and Karen Stacks. If you have been following their periodic reports in the *Celtic Cross* and in worship, you know they have been hard at work: first drafting a job description and "Church Information Form" for Session approval, and then sifting through nearly 100 "Personal Information Forms," of candidates for the position. As you will hear when the APNC reports to you first on September 15 and then at the September 22 meeting, the Committee had two rounds of interviews, one via Skype and one in Pottstown. At the final round of interviews, we joined the Committee to meet with the candidates. We believe that the Holy Spirit was at work, and we join the Committee in their enthusiastic nomination for our Associate Pastor for Children, Youth, and Families.

In our Presbyterian system, the people elect their pastors. But the presbytery examines the candidate to insure that his/her theology and character are suitable for ministry. Our candidate will be examined on September 12; until then, neither the Committee nor we can give you his/her name. So come to worship on September 15 to hear the report, and then stay for the congregational meeting on September 22 to elect your Associate Pastor.

For all of you who are experienced Presbyterians, you know that it is customary for the senior pastor or co-pastors to preach before that vote takes place. But that is not the case with associate pastors, especially those for whom preaching is not a significant part of their job description, as is the case with this position. The vote of the congregation will therefore be based on the report of the Committee and your trust that this Committee has been guided by the Holy Spirit.

On a different note, during September, we will be preaching from an important book in the New Testament, the epistle or letter to the Ephesians. Carter will also be leading a discussion of passages in the epistle in the Forum Class. Ephesians has much wisdom about Jesus Christ and the church and what it means for us as Christians to "grow up in Christ," as Eugene Peterson has put it. God loves us as we are, but we should never be content with staying as we are. Instead, hopefully, we are all seeking to mature in our faith and witness. But how do we do that? Join us as we explore together what Ephesians has to tell us.

Rally Day, the Picnic, the APNC report, and congregational meeting...our congregational cup runneth over in September. Come, drink with us!






