Letter from the Co-Pastors

"I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ" —Philippians 1:6

Dearly Beloved:

We don't know about your vegetable garden this summer, but it seemed like it took forever for our tomatoes to turn from green to red! A cooler than usual August was the culprit and served as a reminder that there is only so much a gardener and farmer can do.

Growing vegetables is a good analogy for growing Christians according to Philip D. Kenneson who writes, "All farmers know that there is always more work to be done than there is time to do it; nevertheless, these same farmers also understand that much of what happens to the crops is beyond their control....The wisdom of the farmer reminds us that both grace and effort, gift and work are required, in full measure, in order to grow anything worth harvesting. The same holds for the life of the Spirit."

As Paul reminds the Philippians, we are all unfinished works, whether we are young or old. Like tomatoes on the vine, for us to grow into something worth harvesting takes both God's grace and our effort, both God's gift and our work. There are no "self-made" men or women; neither are there Christians who have grown deeper in faith and love by accident. To grow, we need to have what John Calvin once called a "teachable spirit" that pays attention and seeks to learn what God has to teach us. And we need to put ourselves in a position to learn and receive what God has to teach us through the community of faith.

We hope you will join us in worship in September as we begin a six-week preaching series on Paul's wonderful letter to the Philippians. Though one of the shorter works of the New Testament, it is one of the most quoted. Paul wrote this letter from prison and there is much "Wisdom Behind Bars" for us all.

We also hope that you will be prayerful and intentional about how God might be calling you to learn, serve, and grow as September offers new beginnings. We are grateful for all those who have signed up to teach Sunday School this year for our children, youth, and adults. Sometimes we find that the best way to grow in our faith is to teach others. We are grateful too that our congregation can offer plenty of other options for learning, serving and growing: together—just check out the rest of this newsletter.

May we continue to be "four generations of Christians seeking together to grow deeper in Christ and reach farther in love."

During the summer, major renovations and improvements were undertaken in our Community Room and adjoining storage space to make this heavily used space more useful, flexible, and attractive. We now have a small kitchen connected directly to the Community Room, where it is needed, and more flexible storage space. We also have an installed projector and screen for audiovisual presentations. The room is better suited for the worship services, receptions, classes, meetings, and special events which take place regularly there.

Please join us in thanking Charlie Jenkins, our carpenter; Dave Hollenbach, who contributed his plumbing expertise; Mike Matrone, who donated days of painting; Bob Hartman, Jr. and Andy Hazeltine, who met with our audiovisual contractor and helped to move furniture back into the room; Dave Duncan, who was an ever-present troubleshooter; and Amy Shutt, who supervised the plans, along with her working team of Barb Peckham, Eileen Wade, Sandy White, and Barb Fletcher. The architect employed for drawing up the plans was a child of this congregation: Jessica Zeigler-Cihlar!

The work is not done. As money becomes available, we will be replacing the seating in the Community Room, Pastors' Conference room, and Mary Ann Yost room, all of which are at least 20 years old (much of it older than that), and, not unexpectedly, showing its age. We are able to undertake these projects through money in the Capital Improvement fund which is largely supported by our Endowment Fund. We are grateful to all those whose gifts to the Endowment Fund have meant that we have not needed to make undertake special appeals to the congregation for repairs and capital improvements as in the past!


