Letter from the Associate Pastor

Friends.

Welcome to a new program year at First Presbyterian Church! September is here and that means a good many things. Days are getting shorter, temperatures are dropping and, before you know it, we will be complaining about the snowfall and having to shovel. However, it also means that we are now getting into sweater weather (I can't wait to break out my cardigans again) and hot chocolate is going to be flowing in abundance. Most of all, it means a new program year here at the church. Sunday School is starting up for kids and adults, the Seekers are up in full swing, Confirmation starts up, the choirs are back to fill our lives with music and weekly Bible studies are returning. Unfortunately that means the end of some of our summer programs. The Seeker hangouts have fallen by the wayside, Backyard Blessings is no more for the year and Mission Mornings will have to wait for next summer.

This is the way of the world. As things come, things go. This is the natural tide of our lives. The ebb and flow of activity is what helps us remember how alive we are. We are driven by the rhythms of the year, getting energy from the movements and patterns that we have established. Our world and our church thrive on rhythms. The rhythm of Young Children and Worship that reflects the rhythm of our worship shows how holy a pattern can be. Meetings that open and close in prayer show the rhythms of our daily lives.

The writer of Ecclesiastes knew the importance of the rhythm of life well. In Ecclesiastes chapter three, the wise teacher tells us "there's a season for everything and a time for every matter under the heavens: a time for giving birth and a time for dying, a time for planting and a time for uprooting what was planted". This chapter, which was later sung by Pete Seeger and even later the Byrds identifies the various rhythms of life. What it does not talk about is the community that walks through these rhythms. We are blessed together to be able to gather as the body of Christ throughout all of these rhythms: to plant together and to reap together the harvests of those seeds, to celebrate the birth of a new member as one family and to mourn together as we bear witness to the life of one of God's children.

As September gets into full swing and the program year starts up we are excited to have you as a part of this body. As we move and sway in the rhythm of life we are honored to have you as our member. I hope you will join us as we experience what the teacher of Ecclesiastes describes: a time for keeping and a time for throwing away, a time for tearing and a time for repairing, a time for keeping silent and a time for speaking, a time for pool parties and a time for caramel apples, a time for 9:30 worship and a time for Sunday School. Ok, I added the last couple myself, but I think he would probably agree with it.

#### **GERMAN REFORMATION AND MUSIC TOUR IN 2016**

On **June 15-25, 2016**, on the eve of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, Carter will lead a tour to Germany and Salzburg, Austria for First Presbyterians and friends. We begin in Berlin and will see remnants of the wall, the Checkpoint Charlie museum, the beautiful Reichstag, and the German Resistance Memorial Center, among other sights. 


